4.1 The Monitoring Committee members were informed about the received Applications and assessment process within the 1st Deadline of the Open call for proposals for standard projects.

AD 5: Discussion and decision on the project approvals, approvals under conditions, rejections, or putting on the reserve list within the 1st Deadline of the Open Call for standard projects

CONCLUSIONS 5:

- 5.1 The Monitoring Committee members decided to approve 8 projects in the frame of Priority 1 (SO 2.4.). The approved projects are the following: CRO-SI-SAFE 2, SPARK, STRIVER, ODPORNI, C.A.R.M.E.N., CROSS-RESS, RESILIO, READY TO ACT
- 5.1.1 The Monitoring Committee members approved the projects under the conditions stated in the Summary appraisal grids and co-formed at the Monitoring Committee meeting as well as conditions set by the Monitoring Committee. MC gave a mandate to the Joint Secretariat to check the fulfilment of conditions, and any other clarifications needed with the Lead partners (in the frame of the face-to-face meetings). The JS/MA can send decision letters to the Lead partners immediately (before the approval of the MC meeting minutes) and start with the procedure for signing the ERDF Subsidy contracts.
- 5.2 The Monitoring Committee members decided that face-to-face meeting for project RESILIO will be attended by representatives of national authorities and/or MC members from relevant ministries.
- 5.3 The Monitoring Committee members decided that project READY TO ACT is approved under conditions, but final ERDF allocation will be determined after potential budget reductions of higher ranking projects under SO 2.4. If no budget reductions are applied, the project will be offered the ERDF funds available (up to 600.790,93 EUR) under SO 2.4. All budget reductions up to total ERDF budget (after their own project budget clearing) under SO2.4 shall be offered to the project. The project must implement the project activities in the full planned scope.
- 5.4 The Monitoring Committee members rejected 21 projects in the frame of Priority 1 (SO 2.4.) due to not reaching the threshold of the 70 points in the quality assessment. The rejected projects are the following: B-READY, SaveWaters, REGreen, LivingIMPACT, PROTOK, LASTMILE+, SMART CHANGE, GreenCYCLE, GREEN4FUTURE, BUCK-CRO-SI, ADAPTOBLOOM, AIOLIVE, PPG, WINE-RES, Fire Connect 2, Aqua Bac, IN2ADAPT, Meje ne obstajajo, ENRAS TT, MEHI, ASCEND.

CONCLUSIONS 6:

- 6.1 The Monitoring Committee members decided to approve 8 projects in the frame of Priority 2 and 3 projects in the frame of Priority 3 (SO 6.2). The approved projects are the following:
- Priority 2: MALA 3ARKA, Hosted by tradition, IstraECOinclusive, DIKULT, MINE STORY, KUL-S-POT, Let it BEE, Green Trails
- Priority 3 (SO 6.2): IntegrAid, INDIGENUM, SI-N-CRO
- 6.1.1 The Monitoring Committee members approved the projects under the conditions stated in the Summary appraisal grids and co-formed on the Monitoring Committee meeting as well as conditions set by the Monitoring Committee. MC gave a mandate to the Joint Secretariat to check the fulfilment of conditions, and any other clarifications needed with the Lead partners (in the frame of the face-to-face meetings). - 6.2. The following projects are put on reserved list due to commitment of all the funds:
- Priority 2: Dravska triologija
- Priority 3 (SO 6.2): Q4AII, PAL-HOME-CARE+

The JS/MA can send the decision letter to the Lead partners before the approval of the MC meeting minutes.

- 6.2.1. The reserved list shall be valid till 31.12.2026.
- 6.3 The Monitoring Committee members rejected 17 projects in the frame of Priority 2 that reached 70 or more points due to commitment of all the programme funds under Priority 2. The rejected projects are the following: PEDAL, VIA AQUA, CBC CHeF, KLOPOTEC, CoalTourSea, GLAGOLITIC, Taste IS-KRA, MultiNavy, GASTRO MOSAIC, SIHR EKO-SLOW, CRAFTNET, Tourism ESG living lab, SciCultureNet, MISTERION 2, BeeConnect, HERitage, KAŠTELIR+.

The JS/MA can send the decision letter to the Lead partners before the approval of the MC meeting minutes.

- 6.4 The Monitoring Committee members rejected 42 projects in the frame of Priority 2 and 8 projects in the frame of Priority 3 (SO 6.2) due to not reaching the threshold of 70 points in the quality assessment. The rejected projects are the following:
- Priority 2: PALEO PARK, DigiWALK, LOCAL MED TASTE, SLOWDIGICYCLING, PJEŠČANI SAT, S(COOL)TUR, AI-WineStory, Mural, Kolpa 360, Inner-city Cinemas, T4Future, LERA, SI CreaTerra, Root & Roam, 3DCULTOUR, IN2HERITAGE, Explorar, Stories4Nature, OVITUR, HEALTHTOUR, SKUPAJ ODPORNI, FuTourism5.0, HER-BORDERS, D-STAR TUR, TOURISMCARES, EXPLORE NOMAD HUB, Kullab, Provod, G.A.S.T.R.O., DEJA VU, TANRES, OAZA UCOM, SPLET, ROM&VENTURES, EXPERITAGE+, Magic, Gastrokultura, KADRIUM, MARIS, GREEN RIDE, Green HERIWave, GREEN-HERITAGE
- Priority 3 (SO 6.2): PharmaTher, MindCare, KLIC(K)4HEALTH, WELLBEING COMMUNITY, NURSE-IS, SAY NO TO BURNOUT, SI-HR EQ, NANO-NOTE

The JS/MA can send the decision letter to the Lead partners before the approval of the MC meeting minutes.





6.5 The Monitoring Committee members decided to reject all projects submitted after the deadline and to close submission of the applications in the monitoring system. Rejected projects are SOCIALL, Z-DRAV-JE and DisKulTur.

- 7.1 The Monitoring Committee members decided that request for project modification for project SLOW LIVING is rejected.
- 7.2 The MC members gave a mandate to the MA/JS to initiate the procedure for withdrawing from the contract pursuant to point e) of paragraph 1 of Article 9 of the ERDF co-financing agreement for the small-scale project NO. SIHR00402 SLOW LIVING.
- 7.3 The MC members were informed about a miscalculation in the allocation of technical assistance across priorities and that amendments to the IP SI-HR may be required to address this issue.
