# 2. OVERVIEW OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE COOPERATION PROGRAMME (ARTICLE 50(2) OF REGULATION (EU) NO 1303/2013 AND ARTICLE 14(3)(A) OF REGULATION (EU) NO 1299/2013)

Key information on the implementation of the Cooperation Programme for the year concerned, including on financial instruments, with relation to the financial and indicator data.

The seventh Annual Implementation Report (AIR) for the Cooperation Programme Interreg V-A Slovenia-Croatia for the programming period 2014-2020 provides information on the progress made in the implementation of the Cooperation Programme during the calendar year 2021.

The Report was prepared by the Government Office for Development and European Cohesion Policy acting as the Managing Authority (MA) of the Cooperation Programme in cooperation with the Joint Secretariat (JS) and programme partners. In line with the agreement reached at the 12<sup>th</sup> Monitoring Committee (MC) which was held on 20 April 2022, the Annual Implementation Report 2021 was approved via 22<sup>nd</sup> written procedure.

All programme structures and both Member States, i.e. Slovenia and Croatia were involved in the implementation of the Cooperation Programme in the calendar year 2021.

Throughout 2021, all programme structures worked intensively on the activities related to the implementation and completion of strategic FRISCO projects and approved projects within the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> deadlines of the Open Call. The 4<sup>th</sup> deadline of the Open Call for submission of projects was published on the programme website on 15 July 2021 focusing on projects in the field of safety and cross-border sustainable mobility services within Priority Axis 3. The deadline for submission of project proposals was 12 October 2021.

In September 2021, MA/JS organised two online workshops for potential beneficiaries of the 4<sup>th</sup> deadline of the Open Call.

15 project applications were submitted under the 4<sup>th</sup> deadline of the Open Call, 8 project applications being in compliance with the set administrative and eligibility criteria, and 7 identified as ineligible.

In January 2022, the Joint Secretariat (JS) began with the quality assessment of the 8 project applications that were in compliance with the set administrative and eligibility criteria.



The COVID-19 pandemic still impacted the implementation of projects activities in 2021. With COVID-19 Guidance for the Projects prepared in 2020, updated in 2021 and thanks to the adopted flexibility regarding the implementation of the projects there were no major delays or problems regarding the implementation of projects activities.

The Annual Implementation Report 2020 was submitted to the European Commission in May 2021 and was later approved by the Commission.

The MA and JS met three times with the programme partners, namely the National Authorities; first at the bilateral technical meeting (BTM) on 23 April 2021 to discuss the topics related to programme implementation, for the second time on 9 June 2021 at a meeting to discuss the open issues regarding the 4<sup>th</sup> deadline of the Open Call and for the third time on 8 December 2021 to discuss the status of strategic projects FRISCO 2.3 and FRISCO 2.3 as well as the 4<sup>th</sup> deadline of the Open Call. Due to the pandemic, all meetings were held online.

Two MC meetings were organised in 2021; the 10<sup>th</sup> MC meeting was organised on 26 January 2021 and the 11<sup>th</sup> MC meeting was organised on 20 May 2021. Both meetings were also held online.

In July 2021, a new public procurement was launched; the contract with the external expert for Impact Evaluation of the CP SI-HR 2014-2020 was signed in August 2021.

In 2021, contracts were also signed with external experts for preparing the future Interreg Programme Slovenia-Croatia 2021-2027 and for preparing the Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) for the future programme.

Five meetings of the Programming Task Force, which is responsible for the programming of the Interreg Programme Slovenia-Croatia 2021-2027 and several public consultations, including six focus groups were organised between May and December 2021.

By the end of 2021, citizens in the involved regions were benefitting from the following concrete results of fully implemented activities covering programme indicators:

- All four FRISCO projects were implemented by the end of September 2021 and had a very good realisation. All the set indicator values were either met or exceeded.
   By the end of 2021 more than 2,230 people benefited from flood protection measures, 31 people gained increased professional capacity due to their participation in cross-border activities in transboundary flood risk and river basin management.
   By the end of 2021 flood risk reduction measures were implemented on 4 transboundary river basin and 6 transboundary river basins have developed joint tools, models and maps for flood risk management;
- As regards projects within PA2, the achieved value of increased number of visits to cultural or natural heritage sites was 836,061. By the end of 2021, 61 small scale investments were made in visitor infrastructure and preservation of natural and cultural heritage, 57 new or improved cross-border sustainable products were developed and 16,675 persons participated in capacity building activities;
- 3,409.75 ha of surface area of habitats achieved a better conservation status and 1,136 persons gained improved practical skills and competences for the implementation of



biodiversity protection measures and valorisation of ecosystem services by the end of 2021;

- Under PA3, 116 institutions participated in new cross-border structures and 2,201 persons gained improved skills and competences in CB service delivery by the end of 2021.

#### Audit of the projects

In 2021, the Group of Auditors (GoA) performed audits of five projects (HITRO, Kaštelir, TA1 MA/JS, VEZI NARAVE, and FRISCO 2.2) with amounts certified in the 7th accounting year, in the total amount of 4.568.471,47 EUR, without detecting any major financial irregularities. The detected irregularities were individual cases and not of systemic nature with all financial corrections already being made.

#### **System audits**

The Audit Authority performed the planned system audits, namely the audit of specific thematic area — withdrawals and recoveries, and system audit of the Managing Authority/Joint Secretariat/National Authority. As regards the system audit of specific thematic area — withdrawals and recoveries, no major findings were made. Based on the audit performed, the Audit Authority assessed that the part of MCS related to withdrawals and recoveries falls under Category 1; namely that no or only minor improvements are needed.

As regards the system audit of the Managing Authority/Joint Secretariat/National Authority, the Audit Authority assessed that MCS in the MA falls under Category 2; namely that the system works, however certain improvements are needed.

#### Information and publicity measures

In line with the Communication Strategy and the planed communication tools, the MA/JS performed or participated in the Stories from the Regions (DG Regio campaign included projects MISTERION and CrossCare), the podcast "This is Europe" (Interact campaign, project story ideas from Interreg programmes, proposed projects CrossCare and 2SoKroG), the Reporting Workshop for Slovenian beneficiaries (First Level Control workshop for CBC programmes), Smart Regions (EC campaign included project Carnivora Dinarica), Interreg Project Slam (proposed project Carnivora Dinarica), the Workshops for potential beneficiaries, the European Cooperation Day and Programme/Project news, newsletter.

On 16 September 2021, the European Cooperation Day 2021 was organised together with the project LIVING CASTLES. Due to the COVID-19 situation, the event was organised in a hybrid form with two separated events with a limited number of participants carried out, namely one in Slovenia in Rakičan and the other one in Croatia in Varaždin.

In September 2021, the MA/JS organised two online workshops for potential beneficiaries of the 4<sup>th</sup> deadline of the Open Call dedicated to projects in the field of safety and cross-border sustainable mobility services. 72 participants joined the event.

In 2021, 25 news items regarding activities, events and relevant information were published on the programme dedicate website (18 news items related to the programme and 10 news items related to projects). All throughout the year, the section of the programme website where news on project activities and results are published was also updated with news items related to projects.



#### **Reimbursement of funds**

By the end of 2021, the activities of all the projects (38) were fully implemented and all the indicators achieved, with some indicators even being exceeded (see Table 2).

In relation to the financial data the total eligible expenditure incurred by beneficiaries and certified to the Commission by the end of 2021 amounts to EUR 45.028.469,59 EUR.

In 2021 the following activities were implemented within the TA projects:  - implementation, management and monitoring of the programme,  - on 16 September 2021 two events were organised in the frame of the European Cooperation Day 2021, one in Slovenia in Rakičan, Murska Sobota and the other one in Varaždin in Croatia,  - three bilateral meetings were organised, on 23 April 2021 and on 8 December 2021 (both on-line), to discuss topics related to the programme implementation,  - advising/supporting the LPs/PPs of the implementing projects and checking the LPs progress reports,  - site visits for the approved projects were carried out according to the Site visit plan for 2021,  - organisation of two MC meetings (in January and May 2021) as well as preparation of written procedures for the MC,  - five meetings of the Programming Task Force for the programming of the Interreg Programme Slovenia-Croatia 2021-2027 were organised between May and December 2021,  - signing of contracts with external experts to prepare the future Interreg Programme Slovenia — Croatia 2021-2027, the Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) of the IP SI-HR 2021-2027 as well as to prepare the Impact

Due to the delays with evaluations in 2020, the MC members decided at the 10<sup>th</sup> MC meeting held on 26 January 2021 to revise the Evaluation Plan in order to prepare only one Impact Evaluation in 2022. The draft tender documentation for the preparation of the Impact Evaluation was prepared in March and April 2021. In July 2021, a new public procurement procedure was launched and in August 2021, the contract with the external expert for the Impact Evaluation was signed. The Impact Evaluation is not finalised (the 1<sup>st</sup> phase of the Impact Evaluation is concluded), therefore we will report about the findings within the Annual Implementation Report 2022.

An example of projects contributing to the EUSDR are all four FRISCO projects. The first project (FRISCO1) started in April 2016 with the objective to improve coordinated flood risk management and reduce flood risks. The main outputs are sets of joint models, maps and tools for each of the six target transboundary river basins (Kupa/Kolpa, Sutla/Sotla, Drava, Mura, Dragonja and Bregana) with the associated design documentation for optimal structural measures, improved physical alert systems, and the outputs of awareness raising/capacity building activities. The ultimate beneficiary of the project is the affected population in the border area between Slovenia and Croatia. The project's objectives can only be achieved through cross-border cooperation because, in line with the Floods Directive, the flood risk management planning should be done following the river basin approach in order to determine the optimal measures. The project is original because of its comprehensiveness, both in terms of spatial coverage (all transboundary river basins) and in terms of the scope of measures (all key non-structural measures covering preparedness, prevention and response). FRISCO2.1, FRISCO 2.2, FRISCO 2.3 are investment projects, where cross-border cooperation is of vital importance as any flood risk reduction measure on a transboundary river needs to be bilaterally coordinated to avoid one-sided approaches that could endanger the other side.
